2005 Cayuse Vineyards Syrah Cailloux Vineyard Walla Walla Valley

The normal cuvee of 2005 Syrah Cailloux Vineyard has an alluring perfume of spice box, meat, game, and blueberry compote. Opulent yet elegant, this hedonistic effort will benefit from 4-6 years of cellaring and provide pleasure through 2020. **97 Points Robert Parker**

2005 Cayuse Vineyards Syrah Cailloux Vineyard Walla Walla Valley

Good bright dark red. Raspberry, pepper, wood smoke, spices and dried herbs on the highly nuanced nose. Darker in its fruit character than the special Walla Walla bottling and less perfumed and expressive today in spite of its silky sweetness. Not especially creamy right now but boasts terrific lift toward the back and palate-staining length. Already delivers great appeal, but needs time to lose some of its baby fat. **94 points**

The first of the Syrah's is the saturated purple 2006 Syrah Cailloux Vineyard (with 4% Viognier in the blend). It displays a Cote-Rotie-like nose of smoked meat, game, and bacon with a dollop of burnt sugar and blueberry making an appearance. Layered, plush, and super-rich, this full-bodied, pleasure-bent effort has exceptional length. Difficult to resist now, it can be enjoyed over the next 10-12 years. **98 Points Robert Parker**

2006 Cayuse Vineyards Syrah Cailloux Vineyard Walla Walla Valley

15.3% alcohol, the only one of these 2006 Syrah's that's over 15%; includes 4% co-fermented Viognier; aged 18 months in all-new oak) Deep ruby-red. Head-spinning aromas of blackberry, boysenberry, raspberry, black olive tapenade, Szechuan peppercorn, gunflint and beef jerky. Deep, sappy and saline, with superb energy to the flavors of dark raspberry, musky brown spices, dark chocolate, black olive and pepper. Finishes with big, broad, dusty tannins and outstanding lift and length. Real wine-class Syrah, expressive from the start but gaining in energy with extended aeration. This was better after 24 hours in the recorked bottle, with flavors of blackberry, black olive and pepper dominating. Winemaker/owner Baron points out that this is his flagship wine, with a production of 750 cases. **94 points Stephen Tanzer**

Sweet, dense and primary, with intense flavors similar to the aromas. Really remarkably energetic and delineated for Washington Syrah, offering outstanding grip and innermouth perfume. This somehow saturates the palate while coming off as weightless. Finishes very long and fine, with lingering notes of pepper, herbs and spices. A great vintage for Cayuse's flagship bottling. **94 Points Stephen Tanzer**

2008 Cayuse Vineyards Syrah Cailloux Vineyards Walla Walla Valley

The 2008 Cailloux Vineyard Syrah contains 4% Viognier. Expressive game, bacon, and blueberry aromas are given uplift by the Viognier component. This savory, rich, lengthy Syrah can be enjoyed now and over the next 10-12 years. **97 Points Robert Parker**

2008 Cayuse Vineyards Syrah Cailloux Vineyard Walla Walla Valley

Dark, bright red-ruby. Smoky aromas of blackberry, black cherry, brown spices and licorice. Highpitched and taut on the palate, with lovely verve and focus to the dark berry and violet flavors. This gripping young Syrah is most impressive today on the very long finish, which features noble tannins and outstanding cling. **94 Points Stephen Tanzer**
