The Wines:

2015 Owen Roe Red Willow Vineyard Syrah \$80 Red Willow is one of Washington's oldest vineyard sites. Syrah was planted by the late great David Lake and if you google Red Willow Vineyard you will be amazed!

(from an early ripening site; 40% new oak): Bright medium ruby. Inviting aromas of black and blue fruits; not a reductive style of Syrah. Densely packed but youthfully tight, showing a hint of primary black fruit sweetness along with medicinal notes of menthol and wild herbs. Made entirely from a Phelps clone, this wine shows a distinct stony character. Very unevolved but finishes chewy and long, with lovely perfumed black raspberry lift. I'm not sure I would have guessed the vintage of this gently extracted wine. but it's a beauty. 92 + Points Vinous-Tanzer

2014 Owen Roe Rosa Mysica Cabernet Franc \$28

This is tasting great now, but will continue to shine for many years in the cellar. An uplifting nose is bursting with aromas of strawberry, green pepper, cocoa powder and spice. The palate is very soft and textural with dried fruit notes, subtle hints of oak and vanilla. The dried fruit notes linger with hints of baking spices, velvety mouthfeel and firm

(David O'Reilly uses carbonic maceration for the Cinsaut component in order to round out its tannins and enhance primary perfume and fruit notes): Moderately saturated medium red. Perfumed, highly nuanced nose offers scents of red raspberry, cherry, meat, red licorice, spices and purple sage, plus a whiff of graphite minerality and a faintly candied quality that carries through onto the palate. Savory and classically dry, with its boysenberry and blackberry fruit flavors complemented by salty minerality. The tannins are fairly light but firm. 91 + Vinous

2016 Owen Roe Abbot's Table \$20 Abbot's Table honors the most fundamental form of hospitality through the ages -the meal. The Abbot's Table traditionally provides an opportunity for fellowship with guests over food and wine. This wine, with its unique varietal diversity, is rich in red fruit notes, with balanced flavors and acidity, exuding charm and texture. It pairs beautifully with many flavors and feasts. The grapes for this wine come from our estate vineyards as well as vineyards farmed by other dedicated families in beautiful eastern Washington State.

2014 Owen Roe Yakima Red \$28

The 2014 Yakima Valley Red Wine from Owen Roe is a blend of Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon. It sports a vibrant ruby/purple tinged color as well as perfumed notes of black cherries, raspberries, leafy herbs and baking spices. Medium-bodied, supple, polished and downright gulpable, it has loads of character and will drink nicely for 5-6 years. 89 Points Wine Spectator

Aged 23 months in 40% new French oak barrels, this signature Owen Roe blend is comprised of 51% Merlot, 34% Cabernet Franc & 15% Cabernet Sauvignon. True to its name, this wine represents the best of these varietals from five Yakima Valley vineyards. (DuBrul, Elerding, Outlook, Red Willow and Union Gap)

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
