This example is sourced from a number of parcels of mature, gnarly Shiraz vines, and aged in a mixture of new and old French oak hogsheads for 12 months. Intense and complex on the nose, which offers an array of fruit accented by notes of chestnuts, burnt toffee, chocolate and lavender. Full and lush on the palate, with a supple texture and good length. Enjoyable immediately, but will develop nicely for up to 5 years in bottle 15.5% ALC

2015 Mollydooker "The Boxer" Shiraz South Australia \$30

Rich and succulent, with spicy clove accents to the plum, apricot and fleshy black cherry flavors at the core. Sarsaparilla and smoke details emerge on the finish. Drink now through 2026. **90 Points Wine Spectator** 16.5% ALC

2014 K Vintners MCK Motor City Kitty Walla Walla, WA \$45

014 had an early spring and a wonderful, long summer with cool nights to help maintain great acidity in the grapes. Going into the fall, temperatures cooled down quite a bit throughout the state, and we were able to hang the fruit for a longer period of time before harvest. This combination allowed us to develop more complex flavors, while still maintaining the acidity, to produce bright, focused wines.14% ALC
