

Santiam Wine & Bistro January 2021 Red Cheap & Cheerful \$72.90

2019 Bousquet Premium Malbec Argentina \$13

Offers a smoky aroma, with refined raspberry and red currant flavors, backed by crunchy acidity. Savory midpalate, with a fine-grained finish that offers black licorice and tar notes. Drink now through 2024. 90 Points Wine Spectator and Wine Spectator Top 100 Ranked number 43

2019 Torremoron Tempranillo, DO Ribera del Duero Spain \$14

Intense smooth and fruity, the notes of black fruit and liquorice predominate adding sweet notes to the whole. The palate is concentrated and smooth, medium bodied, good structure and long finish.

2018 Pendulum Cabernet Sauvignon Columbia Valley \$16

Sleek, yet shows simmering potency in the background. Expressive blackberry, mocha and cinnamon flavors build structure toward fine-grained tannins. Drink now through 2026. 13.9% Alc **91 Points Wine Spectator**

2015 Seven Falls Cellars Wahluke Slope Merlot WA \$14

Tense and focused, with moderate black cherry and fresh tobacco accents. Drink now through 2026. 15.5% Alc

2019 Perazzeta Mercurio Toscana Italy \$12

Bright ripe fruits show through in this linear, clean & friendly combination of Sangiovese, Cab Franc & Alicante. A great daily drinker that shows the boldness of flavors that the Maremma region of Tuscany is known for. 13.5%Alc

2018 Goru Organic Jumilla, Spain \$12

This wine is elaborated during the first week of October with Monastrell grapes selected from our certified organic farming vineyards. The vineyards are on average 25 years old. The separation of the grapes harvested ecologically and conventionally is guaranteed, not only by the facilities, but also by the vinification processes. The wine ages for 2 months in American oak barrels.

2019 Elk Cove Pinot Gris Oregon \$16

2019 Aia Vecchia Vermentino Italy \$14

In the glass, the wine is straw yellow with pale green hues. The bouquet is fresh with zesty aromas of freshly cut grass, grapefruit and hints of salt air. On the palate, the wine has a creamy and round mouthfeel with bright acidity accompanied by hints of limestone and a slight earthiness. The finish is lengthy, dry and refreshing. 90 Point JD Recommended as an aperitif or an accompaniment to fresh seafood, summer salads and poultry.

2018 Willakenzie Pinot Gris Oregon \$15

Extensive lees contact in stainless steel tanks allows this Pinot Gris to maximize fruit expression with notes of pear and papaya. The mouthfeel is rich yet has a strong backbone of acidity which carries the wine to a long finish.
